Kyle Nevins is a seasoned former top aide to the House Republican Leadership with extensive experience in the process and politics of the U.S. Congress. He specializes in a wide variety of business community and advocacy issues and has been recognized for his government affairs work by *Politico Magazine* as one of “50 Politicos to Watch” and *The Hill* as one of Washington’s “Top Lobbyists.” Prior to co-founding Harbinger Strategies, Kyle spent two years as Principal at Capitol Counsel.

Kyle’s congressional career spanned over a decade in the U.S. House, serving as Deputy Chief of Staff to then-Majority Leader Eric Cantor (R-VA), as well as Director of Floor Operations to then-Republican Whip Roy Blunt (R-MO). Kyle helped lead the House Republican vote-counting operation throughout the 2000s, influencing key policy decisions during both the Bush and Obama Administrations. Following Republicans retaking of the majority in 2011, Kyle oversaw House committee and floor activity, guiding the chamber’s legislative strategy on impactful policy accomplishments, including trade agreements, the JOBS Act, and the so-called “fiscal cliff.” His work on Capitol Hill was recognized in *National Journal*, *Politico*, *Roll Call*, and *The Hill*.

In 2011, Kyle helped establish the modern House of Representatives’ calendar and legislative schedule, instituting reforms that both parties have adhered to since. Kyle testified before the House Select Committee on the Modernization of Congress in 2019, providing the committee with insight into the legislative scheduling process.

Kyle sits on the Advisory Board of the Frank Batten School of Leadership and Public Policy at the University of Virginia, as well as the Center for Effective Lawmaking (CEL), a joint research initiative of the University of Virginia and Vanderbilt University. He lectures on the House’s policymaking and vote-counting process for The Brookings Institute and has written on congressional institutional reforms in [The Federalist Society](#).

Kyle is a 2002 graduate of Duke University and studied at University College London. He and his wife, Kristan King Nevins, have three children and live in Washington, D.C.
